Pauline, lost in the heart of barbarity, will witness unimaginable massacres. Pauline will miraculously escape death. She realizes how lucky she is to be alive, while all five of her siblings, her mother, her grandmother, her grandfather, all her uncles, her neighbors, and her Tutsi friends, along with over one million three hundred thousand Tutsis in the country, were murdered in just one hundred days by an extremist Hutu government that had planned this massacre for over thirty years.

Despite this heartbreaking experience, Pauline refuses to lose hope for a better world. She invites you to discover present-day Rwanda, as well as other destinations, on the website. Pauline Kayitare now lives in Belgium and is the mother of two daughters.

She has had the opportunity to share her testimony in several schools in Belgium, Luxembourg, and France. These are very powerful and unforgettable moments. Her memoir serves as a starting point for reflection, in the classroom, on the subject of universal memory and for a personalized journey to discover present-day Rwanda.
